Ladies, Lace and Lawbreakers Sun 14 April 2pm

Meet outside Broadway Cinema, NG1 3AL
Finish at Weekday Cross

Exploring streets around the lace market, learn about 19th century lace workers, the change from “Garden City” to industrial heartland, grand ladies and women that were transported for their ‘crimes’.



Sherwood – people and places Sun, 12 May, 2pm

We'll explore beautiful buildings and fascinating people from Sherwood's past.

The original Women's History walk of Nottingham. Learn about the ‘She Devil of France’, the worn steps of the old Women's Hospital, Alice who died through the ‘instigation of the devil’, Lady Ludd, and what the suffragettes planned for the king's visit.

This walk takes in the grand houses and health and philanthropic institutions in the Rope Walk area of the city. Who was Mary Potter? Who were the census evaders of 1911? What is that round building on Standard Row?

Explore the quieter roads around Trent University taking in Clarendon Road and Chaucer Street. Note hilly terrain.

Discover how Sherwood developed from 'rough gorse' to 'altogether the most elegant suburb in the Neighbourhood of Nottingham'.
